LV's MOVIE NIGHT - MONDAY, MARCH 6 AND MARCH 20

Monday, March 6 at 7 PM in the AR we will screen the movie, *Rudy*. This movie was ranked as one of the most inspiring films of all time by the American Film Institute. It is a biographical film about the life of Daniel "Rudy" Ruettiger, who harbored dreams of playing football at the University of Notre Dame despite significant obstacles. It was the first film that the Notre Dame administration allowed filming on campus since the 1940 movie *Knute Rockne*. The movie is rated PG and is 1 hour and 56 minutes long.

The film tells the story of banker Andy Dufresne who is sentenced to life in the Shawshank State Penitentiary for the murders of his wife and her lover, despite his claims of innocence.
